What is your role at CFGP?

I am the Chief Partner Development Officer here at CFGP. My job is to guide the team's efforts for each of our partners, from various fundraising initiatives to the promotion of an organization's fund with CFGP.

How long have you been with CFGP? In that time, what has been your favorite memory?

I have been with CFGP for 8 years - almost since the beginning! It's so hard to choose one single, favorite memory. Anytime I can be with those we serve I'm happy. One of our first-ever staff volunteer days was at St. John's Hospice, and it's definitely a time I remember fondly. Not only do I cherish the interactions we had throughout the day, but I remember the feeling we had as a team afterward.

Why do you choose to work in the nonprofit sector?

In college, I was actually on a premed track. But I got involved with a student organization that raised funds for the local children's hospital and I fell in love with philanthropy. I'm so grateful to have found my calling early on in my adult life. Ending the day knowing you're helping real people makes the challenging days a little easier.

If you could start your own charity, what would be its mission?

I truly love being able to impact so many different charitable interests, so I don't know that I could ever choose just one! I think I would want to develop an organization that acted as a resource for other nonprofits. The average nonprofit organization has a relatively small operating budget and staff are at capacity carrying out services, but they're doing amazing things in their community. I believe in the power of local nonprofits, so an organization that can help them make an impact through various resources, financial and sector knowledge, would be incredibly rewarding.

In the last few weeks, hundreds of people in Ukraine have been killed and thousands more wounded. Many people have lost their homes. The Ukraine Greek Catholic Church in Kyiv is providing humanitarian aid and assistance to the community during this catastrophic time.

The Building the Church Universal Fund at CFGP is seeking support for this important and life-saving work, including building infrastructure and capacity for humanitarian aid in the Church facilities. The UGCC has opened the basement of its Patriarchal cathedral in Kyiv as a bomb shelter where dozens of people are currently finding refuge.

Every day, in everything we do, we aim to hold true to the principles of faith and service that guide us. Towards that end, our winter was filled with the joy of good work.

Since last fall we established ten new funds, hosted an amazing Catholic Leadership Speaker Series featuring Daniel J. Cellucci, reported an astounding \$1.7 million raised during the #iGiveCatholic campaign, moved our offices to a wonderful new space, launched a new social media platform, welcomed new team members, and more. We would also like to thank everyone who joins us in our mission to serve God and his children. We hope you can take some time to read about the good work that took place at CFGP this winter.

Newly Established Funds

St. Mary of Providence Center Fund - The purpose of the Fund will be environmental beautification, spiritual education/enrichment and social services, and ministries. As well as for the purposes of maintaining the property, infrastructure, plant and equipment, and capital expenditures.

Saint John the Baptist Parish (Ottsville) Fund - This Fund is to be used to support the property, infrastructure, plant, and equipment expenditures of the parish, and support the various social services, ministries, and organizations of its parish community.

St. Charles Borromeo Roman Catholic Church (Drexel Hill) Fund - The Fund is to be used to support the property, infrastructure, plant, and equipment expenditures of St. Charles Borromeo Roman Catholic Church and support the various social services, ministries, and organizations of St. Charles Borromeo Roman Catholic Church.

The Priests' Continuing Education and Leadership Training Fund - The purpose of this Fund will be used to support ongoing leadership formation, training, and education of priests in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, including but not limited to supplies, services, equipment and projects, speaker and workshop/convocation fees above those typically budgeted annually; other educational expenses/services, and other expenditures that support the work and ministry of the priests of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

Vagabond Missions Fund - The Fund supports Vagabond Missions' ministry operations and teams of missionaries to go out and preach the Gospel to those who do not know Jesus by playing games, hosting bible studies, praying with kids, and taking them to retreats and summer camp.

Vagabond Missions: Black & Hispanic Missionary Fund - The Fund focuses on supporting teens who are primarily Black or Hispanic, and studies show that young people respond to teaching if it comes from someone who looks like them or shares a similar background. Its main purpose is to support young adults of color who wish to serve as missionaries.

Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary Program Fund - This Fund shall be used to support the initiatives included in the Saint Charles Borromeo Comprehensive Campaign.

Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary Endowment Fund - The Fund will provide general ongoing support for the seminary.

Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Parish (Hilltown) Sustainability Fund - The purpose of this Fund is to be used to support the property, infrastructure, plant, and equipment expenditures of the parish and support the various social services, ministries, and organizations of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Parish in Hilltown.

St. Kevin Parish (Springfield) Sustainability Fund - The Fund is to be used to support the property, infrastructure, plant, and equipment expenditures of the parish and support the various social services, ministries, and organizations of Saint Kevin Parish.

Catholic Leadership Speaker Series: The Top 5 Mistakes Business Leaders Make in Helping the Church



The fourth installment of our virtual Catholic Leadership Speaker series featured special guest speaker Daniel J. Cellucci, CEO, Catholic Leadership Institute. Dan spoke about the top 5 mistakes business leaders make in trying to help the church. Dan offered the following information:

- **The "ALLEY-OOP"** - Can you dunk a basketball repeatedly? Business leaders should present ideas along with the capacity to see the idea through to completion.
- **Marathon Thinking** - You're in a 5k, they are in a 26.2. Clergy think about the long-term responsibilities that come with an idea and business leaders must help with the long-term plan and follow through.
- **Unbalanced Sheet** - Are we looking at the same ROI? Business leaders need to bridge the gap between the language and mission of the church and business metrics.
- **Non-profit Amnesia** - Why are we quiet in meetings? Business leaders should remember that the clergy are people who need their input, ideas, and actionable items.
- **The Parent Trap** - Do you feel more successful as a parent or as a CEO? Business leaders need to help clergy maximize their potential by understanding what might be in their hearts and minds.
