Macy Becker, development director, didn't know what to expect in their first year. Becker stated, "#iGiveCatholic generated a lot of excitement for the future of the Catholic Center. By the end of #iGiveCatholic 2021, we raised \$36,000 from almost 100 donors. This was the first time we'd participated, and our donors seemed hungry for the opportunity to show how much they love the Center."

This apostolate participated in #iGiveCatholic for the first time in 2021, and will use the money they raised to help fund the many faith formation and service opportunities for junior high and high school students in the region. Mike Giasi, Executive Director, reported, "The sharing of our vision and mission evoked a positive response from donors. We were able to reconnect with benefactors who hadn't given in a while."

Through the #iGiveCatholic 2021 campaign, the Carmelite Monastery of Jackson raised \$43,990, just short of the total needed for renovation and repair of cracked floors in their facility. Additional gifts came in after the

campaign, pushing them well past their \$47,000 goal. The cloistered Sisters released a message, "It is wonderful to know through their loving concern and support that people appreciate the value of a praying community in their area. It means so much to us."
